Face to Face Meetings

- 1. Recommend Title I guidance as an agenda item for an Early Learning Council Meeting

- 3. Present Title I opportunities at local K-12 conferences in conjunction if possible with LEA staff
- 4. Present Title I opportunities at local early childhood conferences
- 5. Meet with State Education Department personnel to understand and encourage their support of using Title I for preschool
- 6. Meet with local superintendents and principals in Title I schools
- 7. Meet with local legislators to help them understand the advantages of using Title 1 for preschool
- 8. Meet with State and/or School District Title I Officer to understand how Title I funds are currently being spent and what future opportunities might be
